Preface

The *Alaska Population Overview* is a portrait of the state's ever-changing population. Population numbers presented here are for residents as defined by the U.S. Census Bureau. The Census Bureau uses the concept of "usual residence" (self-reported) to determine where people are counted. Unlike the definition used for Permanent Fund Dividend eligibility, there is no requirement that a person live in Alaska for a specific amount of time before being considered a resident.

The Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development's Research and Analysis Section, or R&A, prepares population estimates annually for all boroughs, census areas, cities, and census-designated places in Alaska as well as for certain special areas, such as school districts and Alaska Native regional corporations. These estimates are used for a range of purposes, including research and planning, distribution of resources by public and private agencies, and updating population projections.

This edition of the *Alaska Population Overview* consists of four chapters that include population estimates for the state and its boroughs, census areas, and places for each year from 2011 through 2019. This overview also contains information from the 2010 Census and uses the same population concepts and definitions that the U.S. Census Bureau uses.

Development of Estimates

The population estimates begin with data from the last decennial census (2010), with adjustments for known errors in the census and post-census changes in geography. For each year following the last census, R&A creates the latest series of post-census population estimates, or "vintage," by using or revising administrative data that indicate population change. These data include Permanent Fund Dividend applications, military and group quarters surveys and research, and a state

total household population estimate from the U.S. Census Bureau. After release of data from the subsequent decennial census (e.g., Census 2010 for the 2001 to 2009 estimates), we make final adjustments for the intercensal years.

Each year, we update historical population data for the current decade, so users should take time series information from the most recent overview or from R&A's website (laborstats.alaska.gov) rather than adding the current estimate to those published previously.

Executive Overview

State Population Estimate

The population of Alaska was 731,007 in 2019 and represented 0.2 percent of the national population. Fifty-one percent of the population were male, and 49 percent were female. From July 2018 to July 2019, Alaska's total population decreased slightly, by two-fifths of one percentage point.

Age

Alaska's median age was 35.5 in 2019 — somewhat younger than the national median of 38.4. (See Figure 1.5.) The population of Alaskans age 65 or older was 91,278, representing 12 percent of the state. The school-age population (children ages 5 to 17) of Alaska was 134,460, or 18 percent. Areas with larger percentages of Alaska Natives were generally younger.

Race and Ethnicity

Alaska's population was 16 percent Alaska Native or American Indian, 65 percent White, 7 percent Asian, 4 percent Black or African American, 1 percent Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander, and 8 percent multirace in 2019. (See Figure 1.4.) Seven percent of Alaskans were of Hispanic origin. Boroughs and census areas in northern and western Alaska had larger proportions of Alaska Natives. (See Figure 2.6.)

Migration

From 2018 to 2019, Alaska's high migration rates continued, with 34,677 migrating into the state and 42,985 migrating out, for a net migration loss of 8,308 people. (See Table 1.2.) Migration is the most unpredictable component of population change. Relatively small shifts in migration to or from Alaska can have major effects on net migration. The Matanuska-Susitna Borough led the state in growth because of net migration. (See Figure 2.5.)

Births and Deaths

From 2018 to 2019, 9,885 babies were born in Alaska. That's a birth rate of 1.4 per 100 people, compared to 1.2 per 100 for the nation as a whole. Alaska had 4,625 deaths, which is a small number for the size of our population and in line with our population's relatively young age. (See Table 1.1.)

Population Centers

Eighty percent of Alaska's population lived in places with populations of 2,500 or more in 2019. (See Figure 4.1.) Cities with more than 10,000 people included the Municipality of Anchorage (291,845), the City and Borough of Juneau (31,986), and the City of Fairbanks (30,955). These three areas were home to nearly half of Alaska's population.

The five boroughs with the largest populations made up 80 percent of the state in 2019. These included Anchorage, Matanuska-Susitna Borough (106,438 people), Fairbanks North Star Borough (95,898), Kenai Peninsula Borough (58,367), and City and Borough of Juneau.

Households

Alaska had 257,175 households in 2019, and the average size was 2.7 people. Thirty-five percent of households had one or more people under age 18, and 25 percent had one or more people aged 65 or older. (See Table 1.5.)

Group Quarters

The group quarters population lives in dwellings other than households, such as dormitories and prisons. In 2019, 26,988 people lived in group quarters in Alaska, representing 4 percent of the total population. Forty-five percent of Alaska's group quarters population resided in the Municipality of Anchorage or Fairbanks North Star Borough. The Aleutian chain, with its large fishing and seafood processing industries, had the highest percentage of the total population living in group quarters, at 50 percent. (See Table 2.10.)

Military

Alaska was home to 21,407 active duty military personnel in 2019, representing nearly 3 percent of the state's population. Of those, 51 percent were in the U.S. Army, followed by 38 percent in the Air Force and 10 percent in the Coast Guard. Boroughs with large active duty military and dependent populations included the Municipality of Anchorage, Fairbanks North Star Borough, and Kodiak Island Borough. (See Figure 3.1 and Table 3.1.)

Chapter 1

The State Population

Introduction

This chapter covers statewide population trends for Alaska. It contains information on the components of population change as well as discussion of statewide age, sex, race and ethnicity, and household composition. Data provided for decennial census years have an April 1 reference date, and data for all other years have a July 1 reference date.

2019 Population and Density

Alaska had 731,007 residents on July 1, 2019, or 0.2 percent of the U.S. population. The 2019 resident population of the United States, excluding territories and military overseas, was 328,239,523.

Alaska was the third-least populous state in 2019. The states with fewer people were Wyoming with 578,759 and Vermont with 623,989. The District of Columbia also had fewer people than Alaska, at 705,749.

Alaska has 570,641 square miles of land, or 16 percent of the U.S., and its water area is 94,743 square miles. Alaska had 1.3 people per square mile in 2019, in contrast to 93 per square mile for the U.S. as a whole. Excluding Anchorage, which

contains 40 percent of the state's population but only 0.3 percent of the land, Alaska averaged 0.8 people per square mile in 2019.


The majority of Alaskans live in towns, villages, and clustered settlements. Most of the state's land area is owned by the federal government, the state government, or Alaska Native corporations. Excluding these areas, most of which have settlement exclusions or restrictions, about 1 percent of the state's land is under other private ownership. Most of Alaska has moderately dense settlements surrounded by large tracts of uninhabited land.

Alaska Population History

Alaska's population was small before the gold rush in the 1890s, although early territorial censuses were incomplete. The first census in 1880 counted 33,426 people. By 1900, the gold rush had nearly doubled the state's population, to 63,592.

After the turn of the century, the population of Alaska remained roughly the same for 40 years. By 1939, it was 59,278. The state's gold production had declined, and much of the state remained inaccessible.

World War II brought the construction of the ALCAN (Alaska-Canadian) Highway, which resulted in dramatic population growth. The war and ALCAN construction played a key role in the development of Anchorage and Fairbanks in particular.

Alaska's population grew rapidly from the end of World War II in 1945 through the Korean War years of 1950 through 1953. The state gained more than 25,000 people from 1951 to 1952 alone. After that, the population grew at a slower pace until the military buildups for the Vietnam War in the 1960s. At statehood in 1959, Alaska had approximately 224,000 people.

Construction of the 800-mile Trans-Alaska Oil Pipeline dramatically boosted population growth in the 1970s. The pipeline linked the North Slope oilfield of Prudhoe Bay with shipping facilities at Valdez. Pipeline construction peaked in 1975, and the state netted 30,000 movers over a 12-month period. When the pipeline was complete, the state lost population as people moved away. Still, the state gained 48,000 people through migration over the decade.

With new revenue from oil production, Alaska had an economic boom in the early 1980s. The population increased nearly 30 percent, making Alaska the fastest-growing state over that period. It grew most from 1982 to 1983, gaining nearly 25,000 people from net migration alone.

By 1986, falling oil prices triggered a recession. From 1986 to 1987, the state lost more than 19,000 people through net migration and lost 9,400 people overall. The cumulative net out-migration loss from 1986 to 1989 was about 40,000 people. The state had a high number of births during those years, but the population still dropped more than 2 percent

from its 1986 level. By the end of the decade, net migration numbers became positive again.

Alaska's population increased more than 36 percent from 1970 to 1980 and nearly 32 percent from 1980 to 1990. For comparison, the U.S. as a whole grew by slightly more than 10 percent from 1970 to 1980 and another 10 percent from 1980 to 1990.

The 1990s began with three years of economic recovery and net migration gains that were followed by a period of net migration losses due in part to military base closures. Birth rates also declined in the 1990s as baby boomers (people born between 1946 and 1964) aged past childbearing years. The state's population increased 14 percent for the decade, slightly more than for nation as a whole.


Alaska then grew steadily from 2000 to 2010, and although high population turnover continued due to migration, the gains and losses were fairly balanced through 2009. From 2009 to 2010, the state's net migration gain approached 8,500 people, the most for a single year since the 1980s. This big gain was likely related to the late-2000s recession, which affected the nation far more severely than it did Alaska.

Growth slowed in 2013 due to net migration losses, and the state lost population from 2016 to 2019 for the first time since the late 1980s.

Components of Change

Population change is made up of natural increase (births minus deaths) and migration, as shown in Table 1.1. Natural

increase is a stable component of population change because birth and death trends don't change quickly. Migration is a volatile component of population change in the state, sometimes shifting dramatically from one year to the next.

Births and Deaths

Births and deaths are an important part of population change for Alaska and are closely tied to the state's age structure as well as age-specific fertility and mortality rates. Table 1.1 shows annual trends in the crude birth rate (number of births divided by the total population) and crude death rate in Alaska.

Newborns have accounted for between 1 and 2 percent of the yearly population since the early 1990s, when the large baby boomer population aged past child-bearing years. Between 10,000 and 12,000 babies have been born each year in Alaska since the mid-2000s, but the number fell slightly below 10,000 for 2018 to 2019.

Alaska's crude death rate has increased steadily over time as the state's population has aged, from a low of 0.38 percent of the population in the mid-1980s to 0.63 percent in 2019. Alaska now has more than 4,000 deaths each year, up from around 2,000 per year in the mid-1980s.

As Figure 1.3 shows, Alaska's ratio of births to deaths has shifted substantially over time. From 1980 to 1981, 5.7 Alaskans were born for every person who died during the


same period. Ten years ago, from 2008 to 2009, the births-to-deaths ratio was 3.3, and from 2018 to 2019 the ratio was 2.1.

Birth rates can also be analyzed with a measure called the "total fertility rate," which is the total number of children that would be born to a woman if she lived her entire life with that year's age-specific fertility rates, or the number of births per woman by age. A total fertility rate of around 2.1 is necessary for a population to replace itself through births alone. Based on data from the National Center for Health Statistics, the total fertility rate for the U.S. was between 1.7 and 2.0 from the early 1970s to the late 1980s. In 1990, the national total fertility rate reached 2.1 children per woman and remained between 1.7 and 2.1 through 2019.

Alaska's total fertility rate has consistently topped the national rate. Based on Alaska birth records and annual population estimates, Alaska's rate from the early 1970s through the late 1980s was between 2.0 and 2.5. In 1990, Alaska's total fertility rate reached more than 2.6, then fluctuated between 2.2 and 2.6 through 2010. Alaska's TFR remained around 2.2 through 2015 but has since declined to 2.0.

"Life expectancy at birth" for a given year is the number of years a person would live if that person lived an entire life with that year's age-specific mortality rates. According to the National Center for Health Statistics, the national life expectancy at birth increased steadily from 73.7 in 1980 to 78.7 in 2018. Based on Alaska death records and annual population estimates, Alaska's statewide life expectancy increased from 72.1 in 1980 to 78.3 in 2018.

Migration

As shown in Figure 1.2 and Table 1.2, net migration can vary widely from year to year. Tens of thousands of people move both to and from the state each year, and relatively small fluctuations in the number moving in or out can yield a large net gain or loss.

In recent years, fluctuations in net migration for Alaska have often been attributed to economic trends and events, but troop movements are significant as well. Much of the migration to and from Alaska depends on the stationing of military personnel, which is tied to historical events and planning at the federal level.

The majority of people living in Alaska are migrants to the state — statistics from the U.S. Census Bureau's 2014-2018 American Community Survey show 59 percent

of Alaskans were born outside the state. Regionally, these proportions varied from more than 75 percent in Denali Borough, Aleutians West Census Area, and Skagway Municipality, to a low of 5 percent in the Kusilvak Census Area. Forty-two percent of Alaskans residing in places other than the state's five most populous boroughs were born outside Alaska versus 67 percent in Fairbanks North Star Borough, 63 percent in Anchorage and Kenai Peninsula Borough, and roughly 60 percent in Matanuska-Susitna Borough and City and Borough of Juneau.

The 2019 ACS indicates 8 percent of Alaskans were foreign-born, up from 6 percent during the 2000 Census. For the U.S., 14 percent were foreign-born in 2019, up from 11 percent in 2000.

At the state and national levels, data to track annual migration are available from the Internal Revenue Service's Tax Statistics, and these show Alaska has among the highest rates of gross migration (in-migration plus out-migration) in the nation. Only the District of Columbia's 18 percent gross migration rate was higher than Alaska's 12 percent for 2010 to 2018. The states with the next-highest rates were Wyoming (11 percent), Hawaii (10), and North Dakota (10).

The states that exchange the most people with Alaska typically have large populations or are close geographically. From 2010 to 2018, Washington sent and received the highest number of movers to and from Alaska, followed by Texas and California.

Race and Ethnicity Categories

Race and ethnicity categories used by the U.S. Census Bureau have changed over the decades, and this affects the comparability of data from different years. Major race groupings in 2010 Census data are White, Black or African American, American Indian or Alaska Native, Asian, and Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander. Individuals may write in their race under "some other race," and those responses are then assigned one of the major race categories. Tables noted "modified race data" in this publication include the adjustment for some other race, and those without that note do not have the adjustment. There is also an ethnic categorization, which is separate from race, where people can report Hispanic origin.

Because the American Indian population in Alaska is quite small relative to the Alaska Native population, the term "Alaska Native" is used in this publication to refer to "American Indian or Alaska Native." "Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander" is sometimes shortened to "Hawaiian or Pacific Islander" or just "Pacific Islander."

The 2000 Census brought a fundamental change to race and ethnicity data collection by giving respondents the option to report more than one race. As a result, race data from the 2000 and 2010 censuses are not directly comparable to race data from previous censuses.

Because data in the pre-2000 categories are still in demand by some data users, Research and Analysis and the National Center for Health Statistics provide bridged-race estimates, which assign all individuals to a single race group.

Historical Alaska Native Population


Few reliable data are available on the overall size of the Alaska Native population before the 1929 territorial census. In 1929, 29,983 Alaska Natives made up 51 percent of Alaska's population. Although the Alaska Native population has grown rapidly since 1929, the non-Native population has grown more rapidly. (See Table 1.3.)

Current Race and Ethnic Composition

The Alaska Native or American Indian (alone) population in Alaska was 113,714 in 2019, or 16 percent of the state's total, a bigger proportion than any other state. For comparison, New Mexico's population was 11 percent American Indian (alone) and Hawaii's was 10 percent Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander (alone), according to the U.S. Census Bureau's 2019 Population Estimates program.

Alaska's White (alone) population was 477,041, or 65 percent

of the state. (See Figure 1.4 and Table 1.4.) Alaska had 52,842 Hispanic residents in 2019, which was 7 percent of the state total. People of Hispanic origin can be of any race.

Population by Age

The size of different age groups is affected by aging as well as births, deaths, and migration. Alaska's age structure as of 2019 is shown in Table 1.15 and figures 1.5 and 1.6. Second to aging, the largest influence on Alaska's age structure is migration, which is particularly high for 18-to-35-year-olds and their children younger than school age.

While Alaska's total population increased 3 percent from the 2010 Census to July 2019, children under the age of 5 decreased 8 percent, from 53,996 to 49,686. The number of young children reached a low of 47,270 in 2001 before rising steadily for 10 years, then declining again. Although births are the primary driver of the number in this age group, migration also has an effect on it.

The population aged 5 to 13 are of elementary and middle school age. This group grew 4 percent from 2010 to 2019, from 91,587 to 95,117, and made up 13 percent of the state population in 2019.

The number of youths aged 14 to 17 has declined 6 percent since 2010, from 41,795 to 39,343 in 2019. This age group reached its peak size in 2005 at 46,332. Five percent of the state's population was in this age group in 2019. In general, teenagers are less subject to changes in migration flows than younger age groups.

Overall, the number of people 0 to 19 years old has remained remarkably steady since the mid-90s, hovering slightly above 200,000. (See Figure 1.6.)

The 18-to-24 age group — which has very high rates of migration for school and work — has decreased 14 percent since 2010, from 74,881 to 64,067 in 2019. People in this age group made up 9 percent of the state's population in 2019. In general, migration yields a net loss of people at ages 18 and 19, followed by a net gain for ages 20 to 24.


The population aged 25 to 34 is composed of young adults in prime ages for forming families, and people in this age group contribute heavily to the number of children under age 5. In 2019, 15 percent (111,959) of Alaska residents were 25 to 34 years old, the same percentage as in 2010 (103,125). This age group peaked in size in 1985 at 130,452, representing nearly a quarter of the

state's population that year. Alaska typically has strong net migration gains of people aged 25 to 34.

The size of Alaska's population aged 35 to 44 grew 4 percent from 2010 to 2019. The group was 13 percent of the state in 2019 with 96,854 people, and 13 percent of the state in 2010 with 92,974 people.

The 45-to-54 age group decreased from 16 percent (111,026) of the state in 2010 to 12 percent in 2019 (85,422) as baby boomers aged out of it. The affect of baby boomers aging can also be seen in Figure 1.6, with the 40-to-59 age group






steadily climbing until the mid-00s, plateauing for several years, then declining as more joined the 60-plus group.

Despite typical net migration losses of people aged 55 to 64, this group has grown sharply since 2010 as baby boomers in the state aged. The state had 97,281 in this group in 2019 (13 percent of the state total), up from 85,909 in 2010 (12 percent).

Alaskans aged 65 and older numbered 91,278 in 2019, and the size of Alaska's population aged 55 to 64 suggests the number of seniors will increase dramatically over the next decade. The 65-plus group increased from 8 percent of the state total in 2010 to 12 percent in 2019.

The growth rate from 2010 to 2019 for seniors in Alaska was higher than any other state — but, as of 2019, Alaska's percentage of senior citizens remained among the smallest of any state. In the U.S. as a whole, 16 percent of the population was 65 or older in 2019.

Median Age

Alaska's population is younger than the national average but the gap is narrowing, largely due to the aging of Alaska's large baby boomer population. (See Figure 1.5.) The U.S. median age in 2019 was 38.4, and the median age for Alaska was 35.5. Alaska had the fourth-youngest population

in the U.S. after Utah (31.3), the District of Columbia (34.2), and Texas (35.0). In 2010, the U.S. median age was 37.2, and Alaska's was 33.8.

By race, the median ages of Alaskans in 2019 were: 39.0 for White alone, 29.6 for Alaska Native alone, 31.8 for Black alone, 36.5 for Asian alone, 28.2 for Hawaiian and Pacific Islander alone, and 19.8 for people of two or more races. The median age for people of Hispanic origin was 26.8.

The Alaska Native population is generally younger because of higher birth rates and a smaller baby boomer population. The Black, Hawaiian and Pacific Islander, and Hispanic populations are younger due to a combination of higher birth rates and the age and year of migration for the share who moved to Alaska. The low median age for those who are of two or more races is the result of an increasing proportion of multiracial children and, perhaps, a greater tendency of younger multiracial Alaskans to identify as such.

Voting Age Population

As of July 1, 2019, the voting age population (those 18 and older) in Alaska totaled 546,861. Of that population, the White alone group was 375,918 (69 percent), Alaska Native alone was 76,820 (14 percent), Asian alone was 37,256 (7 percent), Black alone was 20,329 (4 percent), Hawaiian or Pacific Islander alone was 7,101 (1 percent), and people of two or more races totaled 29,437 (5 percent). An estimated 34,606 voting-age Alaskans (6 percent) were of Hispanic origin.

Dependency


Dependency ratios are ratios of the working-age population (ages 18 to 64) to the young and old largely nonworking populations. In 2019, for every 100 Alaskans aged 18 to 64, there were 40 Alaskans younger than 18 (same as 2010) and 20 Alaskans 65 or older (up from 12 in 2010). For comparison, the U.S. had 36 children and 27 seniors for every 100 people of working age in 2019.

Male-to-Female Ratio

Alaska had 106 males for every 100 females in 2019 — much higher than the national ratio of 97 to 100, but down from 2010's ratio of 109 to 100.

By race, the male-to-female ratio was 109 for White alone, 101 for

Alaska Native alone, 123 for Black alone, 86 for Asian alone, and 100 for Hawaiian or Pacific Islander alone. The particularly high male-to-female ratio for Black Alaskans reflects the large share of the state's Black population in the military. The low male-to-female ratio for Asian Alaskans reflects a nationwide phenomenon (93 Asian males for every 100 Asian females).

States with younger populations tend to have higher male-to-female ratios, in part because the ratio at birth is typically around 105 and also because life expectancy is generally lower for males, so the ratio decreases at higher ages. Employment can also affect male-to-female ratios for certain areas, such as the military, fishing, and mining in Alaska. Other states that had high ratios as of the Census Bureau's 2019 population estimates were North Dakota (105) and Wyoming (104).

While Alaska had very large male-to-female ratios at some points in its history — including the gold rush era and during large military buildups — and continues to have the highest ratio in the nation, the difference is sometimes exaggerated. Some communities are heavily male due to local industries, but most have ratios close to the U.S. average.

As shown in Figure 1.8, the highest ratio of males to females was for the 20-to-24-year-old group, at 120. Ages 65-69 were also high at 108. The relatively high male-to-female ratio at higher ages in Alaska is because more young adult males moved to the state in the 1970s and 1980s than females.

Alaska Households and Living Arrangements

The Census Bureau counts all people as living in a housing unit, such as a house or apartment, or a group quarters facility, such as a dormitory or prison. A household includes all the people who occupy a housing unit as their usual place of



residence.

The number of households in Alaska decreased by 883 from 2010 to 2019, while the number of people per household increased from 2.65 to 2.74. Among Alaska households, 35 percent had one or more people younger than 18 in 2019, and 25 percent had one or more people 65 or older. (See Table 1.5.)

Four percent of the state's population (26,988 people) lived in group quarters — prisons, college dorms, military barracks, nursing homes, residential treatment facilities, and fish processing and logging camp bunkhouses — in 2019, which was similar to 2010, when 26,352 people (also 4 percent) lived in group quarters.

Chapter 2

Alaska Boroughs and Census Areas

Introduction

This chapter presents detailed estimates of population by age, race, and sex for Alaska's boroughs and census areas. It also provides comprehensive analysis of geographic variation for population trends, households, components of change, and population composition.

Boroughs and Census Areas

As of July 1, 2019, the state had 19 organized boroughs, which are equivalent to counties in the rest of the United States. The three types of boroughs vary by the services they provide and their relationships with city governments.

The Municipality of Anchorage, the City and Borough of Juneau, the City and Borough of Sitka, and the City and Borough of Wrangell are unified home rule municipalities where the city government and borough government are merged.

The other two types are distinguished by the level of services they are required to provide. These 15 boroughs are not


unified, and although most contain organized cities within the borough boundaries, some do not. Bristol Bay Borough, Haines Borough, the Municipality of Skagway, and the City and Borough of Yakutat contain no incorporated cities.

The U.S. Census Bureau divides the remaining unorganized territory, which accounts for about 56 percent of the state's land area, into 10 census areas for statistical purposes.

Although these are only statistical units, the federal government considers them county equivalents. Most census area boundaries follow Alaska Native Regional Corporation and Regional Educational Attendance Area boundaries. All of the census areas contain incorporated cities.

It's not always possible to make direct historical comparisons for each area because of new borough formations and boundary changes over the years. Maps of boroughs and census areas at the time of each decennial census are available upon request and are also on the Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development's Research and Analysis website (laborstats.alaska.gov).

There were a few major boundary changes in the late 2000s and early 2010s. In 2007, the Municipality of Skagway was formed out of part of the Skagway-Hoonah-Angoon Census Area. The remaining area is now the Hoonah-Angoon Census Area.

The City and Borough of Wrangell was formed in 2008 out of the Wrangell-Petersburg Census Area and part of the former Prince of Wales-Outer Ketchikan Census Area. The remainder of the former Wrangell-Petersburg Census Area was renamed Petersburg Census Area.

The Ketchikan Gateway Borough annexed what remained of the Outer Ketchikan Census Subarea in 2008, except Hyder. The Prince of Wales-Outer Ketchikan Census Area was renamed Prince of Wales-Hyder Census Area.

Petersburg Borough incorporated in January 2013, replacing the former Petersburg Census Area and further changing the boundaries of Hoonah-Angoon Census Area and Prince of Wales-Hyder Census Area.


In 2015, the former Wade Hampton Census Area was renamed Kusilvak Census Area. Its boundaries remained the same.

All numbers presented here are based on the Census Bureau's 2019 geographic boundaries.

Population Trends

Alaska's growth has been strong but varied over recent

decades. Most growth has been in the state's urban areas, as shown in Figure 2.1, which illustrates how the Anchorage/Matanuska-Susitna Region's population has become increasingly dominant.

In 2019, 80 percent of Alaska's population was in the following five boroughs: Municipality of Anchorage (40 percent), Matanuska-Susitna Borough (15 percent), Fairbanks North Star Borough (13 percent), Kenai Peninsula Borough (8 percent), and City and Borough of Juneau (4 percent). Figure 2.2 compares the growth rates of these boroughs by decade back to 1960.

Population growth in Alaska has been uneven over the last 30 years. From 1980 to 1985, the state grew at an average annual rate of 6 percent. Because of the economic bust in the late 1980s, the state only grew an average of 0.2 percent annually from 1985 to 1990. During the 1990 to 1995 period, Alaska grew by an average of almost 2 percent a year. From 1995 to 2000, the rate slowed to just under 1 percent. From 2000 to 2005, the rate was steady at 1.2 percent per year on average, which picked up toward the end of the decade to reach an average of 1.3 percent annually from 2005 to 2010.

The state's population grew by 0.3 percent on average each year from 2010 to 2019, with the majority of growth in the Matanuska-Susitna Borough. The Matanuska-Susitna Borough's growth rate was the fastest at an average of 1.9 percent annually during the past nine years — more than six times the statewide average. Population growth was also strong in the Municipality of Skagway (1.3 percent) and Kusilvak Census Area (1.0 percent).

In contrast, the boroughs and census areas with the greatest average annual population losses during the same period were the City and Borough of Yakutat (-2.2 percent), Bristol Bay Borough (-1.5 percent), Yukon-Koyukuk Census Area (-0.8 percent), and Aleutians East Borough (-0.7 percent). (See Table 2.1.)

Population Density

Overall, Alaska's land area is 16 percent of the entire United States. In 2019, Alaska averaged 1.3 people per square mile, in contrast to 93 people per square mile nationally. These numbers can be misleading, however, because high rates of federal, state, and Native land ownership — in addition to limited accessibility — preclude settlement on much of Alaska's land mass.

The Municipality of Anchorage's population density was by far the highest in

Alaska in 2019, at roughly 170 people per square mile. Anchorage was followed by the Fairbanks North Star Borough at 13 and the City and Borough of Juneau with 12. The lowest population density was in the Interior Region, with the Yukon-Koyukuk Census Area having 0.04 people per square mile. Fifteen boroughs and census areas had population densities of less than one person per square mile.

Some borough and census area populations live within a small part of their total geographic area, so population density in settled areas may be considerably higher than that of the official boundaries. For example, most of the population of the Matanuska-Susitna Borough is concentrated in the area between the Matanuska and Little Susitna rivers. Population density in that area is much greater than that of the borough overall; for example, Wasilla had more than 650 people per square mile while the borough averaged four.

Group Quarters

In 2019, 45 percent of Alaska's group quarters population lived in the Municipality of Anchorage and Fairbanks North Star Borough. Group quarters in these areas are largely military barracks, University of Alaska dormitories, State of Alaska


correctional facilities, group homes, nursing homes, and homeless shelters.

The Aleutians East Borough and Aleutians West Census Area continued to have very large group quarters populations connected with fishing and the seafood processing industry, with 50 percent of their combined total population in group quarters in 2019. Tables 2.2 to 2.11 provide household and group quarters data for all boroughs and census areas.

The North Slope Borough had an estimated 2,661 people (27 percent of its total population) in group quarters in 2019. This was primarily due to 2010 Census counts of employees at remote work sites in the borough who were not counted at the sites in previous censuses.

Other areas with relatively high shares in group quarters were the Denali Borough (6 percent), Southeast Fairbanks Census Area, Northwest Arctic Borough, and Fairbanks North Star Borough, each with 5 percent. Group quarters in the Denali Borough, Southeast Fairbanks Census Area, and Fairbanks North Star Borough are largely military. Fairbanks North Star Borough is also home to a large number of college students in dormitories. Mining accounts for the group quarters population in the Northwest Arctic Borough.

Housing Units and Households

A household includes all the people who occupy a housing unit as their usual place of residence. Tables 2.2 through 2.11 provide household data for boroughs and census areas.

The number of households, which are occupied housing units, in 2019 was estimated at 257,175, basically unchanged from 2010. The state's number of people per household edged up from 2.65 to 2.74.

Areas with larger household sizes are in the northern and western areas of the state. In 2019, these included Kusilvak Census Area with an average of 4.09 people per household followed by North Slope Borough (3.84), Northwest Arctic Borough (3.81), Bethel Census Area (3.63), and Nome Census Area (3.41).

The smallest households were in Bristol Bay Borough with 2.06 people on average, Denali Borough (2.07), Haines Borough (2.14), and Municipality of Skagway (2.17). Southeast Alaska is well-represented on the list of small household sizes, as its population is older so fewer households include children.

Components of Population Change

Population change has two parts: natural increase, which is births minus deaths, and net migration, which is in-migration minus out-migration. These components of change are presented in Table 2.12, which also includes birth and death rates for each area. (Also see figures 2.4 and 2.5.)

The Matanuska-Susitna Borough gained the most people from 2010 to 2019 (+17,443), followed by Kenai Peninsula Borough (+2,967), and Bethel Census Area (+1,118). The areas that lost the most net population between 2010 and 2019 included Fairbanks North Star Borough (-1,683), Kodiak Island Borough (-591), and Yukon-Koyukuk Census Area (-390).

Births and Deaths


The 2010 to 2019 average annual birth rate for Alaska was 1.5 births per 100 people, slightly less than the average annual birth rate for 2000 to 2010 of 1.6 but above the national rate of 1.2 from 2010 to 2019.

The highest birth rates were in areas with higher-than-average numbers of Alaska Natives. The Kusilvak Census Area had the highest average annual rate from 2010 to 2019, with 3.0 births per 100 people. Other areas with high rates included Bethel Census Area (2.4), Northwest Arctic Borough (2.4), and Nome Census Area (2.3).

Birth rates were lowest in the Aleutians and Southeast Alaska. Aleutians East Borough and Aleutians West Census Area, where nearly two-thirds of the population are male, had average annual rates of 0.5 and 0.6 per 100, respectively. The lower-than-average birth rates in Southeast Alaska are due to its older population. Haines Borough had an average annual birth rate of 0.8 per 100 people from 2010 to 2019.

Alaska's average annual death rate was 0.6 per 100 people from 2010 to 2019 — higher than the rate from 2000 to 2010, which was 0.5. The death rate is closely related to age and

is expected to increase over time as Alaska's median age increases.

The boroughs/census areas with the lowest average annual death rates in the state from 2010 to 2019 were the Aleutians East Borough and the Aleutians West Census Area, with 0.2 and 0.3 deaths per 100 people, respectively. The state's highest death rates were in the Yukon-Koyukuk Census Area (1.1) and the City and Borough of Wrangell (0.9).

Migration

Migration is made up of in-migration and out-migration flows. Net migration is in-migration minus out-migration for a given place. The total volume of population turnover due to migration (in-migration and out-migration) is called gross migration.

Alaska has one of the nation's highest rates of population turnover from migration. There are large migration flows within the state as well, particularly to and from the state's major population centers. From 2010 to 2019, five of Alaska's six economic regions had net migration losses to the sixth region, Anchorage/Mat-Su.

The highest average annual rate of net migration (or rate of change in population size due to migration) from 2010 to 2019 was in the Matanuska-Susitna Borough at 1.1 percent. The Municipality of Skagway had the next-highest rate at 0.8 percent.

The boroughs and census areas with the highest rates of loss

due to net migration from 2010 to 2019 include City and Borough of Yakutat at 2.9 percent of the population per year, followed by Bristol Bay Borough (-1.8 percent).

Some areas have high rates of population loss because of net migration but maintain their size through natural increase. An example is Nome Census Area, which had an average net migration loss of 1.1 percent per year from 2010 to 2019, yet its total population grew 3 percent during the same period.


Proportion Alaska Native

Boroughs and census areas in the Southwest, Northern, and Interior regions have the highest proportions of Alaska Natives. (See Figure 2.6.)

As described in Chapter 1, respondents were able to select more than one race on the 2000 and 2010 Census forms, so there are at least three measures of population by race: race alone, race alone or in combination with other races, and bridged race. Bridged-race data, which are available upon request, provide estimates for population by race in which all respondents are assigned a single race. Also, tables noted "modified race data" in this publication include the adjustment for "some other race," as described in Chapter 1.

The Municipality of Anchorage had the largest number of Alaska Natives alone (26,556) in 2019. The share of Anchorage's total population that was Alaska Native was relatively low, though, at 9 percent. (See tables 2.13 through 2.22.) The area with the second-largest Alaska Native alone population

in 2019 was Bethel Census Area (15,210). Eighty-four percent of the area's population is Alaska Native alone.

The five boroughs/census areas with the highest numerical increases in residents reporting their race as Alaska Native alone between 2010 and 2019 were the Municipality of Anchorage (+2,681), Matanuska-Susitna Borough (+2,395), Bethel Census Area (+1,085), and Fairbanks North Star Borough (+876).

In 2019, 44 percent of people who were Alaska Native alone lived in areas that were more than half Native.

Due to migration from rural to urban areas, the proportion of the Alaska Native (alone) population living in boroughs that were 10 percent or less Alaska Native alone grew to 41 percent in 2019, up from 38 percent in 2010.

Boroughs/census areas that were 10 percent or less Alaska Native alone in 2019 included Municipality of Skagway (5 percent), Denali Borough (5 percent), Matanuska-Susitna Borough (7 percent), Kenai Peninsula Borough (8 percent), Fairbanks North Star Borough (8 percent), and Municipality of Anchorage (9 percent).

Further race data for boroughs and census areas, including annual estimates by age and sex, are available on the Research and Analysis website (laborstats.alaska.gov).

Male-to-Female Ratio

The male-to-female ratio is the number of males per 100

females. In 2019, there were 106 males for every 100 females statewide. The boroughs and census areas with the highest male-to-female ratios were Aleutians East Borough and Aleutians West Census Area at 190 each, North Slope Borough (157), Southeast Fairbanks Census Area (121), Prince of Wales-Hyder Census Area (119), and Denali Borough (117). Many of these areas have large fishing, seafood processing, oil and gas, or mining industries or significant military populations, which have proportionately more men.


The boroughs and census areas with the lowest average male-to-female ratios were Haines Borough (98), City and Borough of Sitka (99), City and Borough of Wrangell (100), Petersburg Borough (101), Municipality of Anchorage (101), City and Borough of Juneau (102), and Ketchikan Gateway Borough (103). In general, urban areas and areas with older populations tend to have lower male-to-female ratios.

Median Age

Alaska's median age was estimated at 35.5 in 2019, an increase from 33.8 in 2010. As discussed in Chapter 1, Alaska's population is aging roughly in line with the trend throughout the United States. The U.S. median age was 38.4 in 2019, up from 37.2 in 2010.

The Alaska areas with the oldest median age as of 2019 were Haines Borough (48.6), Hoonah-Angoon Census Area (47.7), City and Borough of Wrangell (47.5), Aleutians East Borough (44.6), and City and Borough of Yakutat (43.6).

The youngest median ages in 2019 were in the Northern and Southwest regions of the state. These areas included Kusilvak Census Area (24.3 years), Bethel Census Area (27.6), Northwest Arctic Borough (28.4), and Nome Census Area (29.1).

The largest increases in median age from 2010 to 2019 were in the City and Borough of Yakutat (+3.9 years), Fairbanks North Star Borough (+2.8), and Northwest Arctic Borough (+2.7). The largest decreases were in the North Slope Borough (-1.4 years) and Valdez-Cordova Census Area (-1.2).

Seniors

The proportion of the state population aged 65 and older was 12 percent in 2019. The older population steadily increased from 3 percent in 1980 to 4 percent in 1990, then up to 6 percent in 2000 and 8 percent in 2010. Although Alaska still has one of the smallest percentages of seniors (only Utah's is lower), it is following the nationwide aging trend.

Some parts of Alaska had higher concentrations of older Alaskans than others. Southeast was highest. Hoonah-Angoon Census Area led the state with 23 percent, followed by Haines


Borough and City and Borough of Wrangell at 22 percent. Twenty percent of both Petersburg Borough and Yakutat Borough were 65-plus. (See Figure 2.7.)

Areas outside Southeast with relatively large shares of seniors were Kenai Peninsula Borough (19 percent), Southeast Fairbanks Census Area (16 percent), and Yukon-Koyukuk Census Area (15 percent).

The North Slope Borough, with its large group quarters population, had one of the lowest shares of seniors in 2019, at just 6 percent. Other areas with relatively few older Alaskans included Kusilvak Census Area (6 percent), Northwest Arctic Borough, Nome Census Area, and the Aleutians, all with 8 percent.

In 2019, 81 percent of Alaska seniors lived in the following areas: Municipality of Anchorage (37 percent), Matanuska-Susitna Borough (15 percent), Fairbanks North Star Borough (12 percent), Kenai Peninsula Borough (12 percent), and City and Borough of Juneau (5 percent). Many senior citizens choose or need to live in urban areas, where medical care and other necessities are more accessible.

Chapter 3

Special Populations and Areas

Introduction

This chapter includes frequently requested estimates of the populations of the military, legislative districts, school districts, Alaska Native Regional Corporations, Alaska Native Village Statistical Areas, and adjacent areas in Canada.

Armed Forces

In 2019, Alaska had 21,407 active duty military personnel with 29,406 dependents. (See Table 3.1.) The Army, Air Force, and Coast Guard make up nearly all of the military population. With the closure of Adak's naval air station in 1997, the Navy no longer maintains a significant presence here.

As of 2019, most of the military population was Army, at 51 percent. (See Figure 3.1.) Alaska's Army bases are in Anchorage (Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson), Fairbanks (Fort Wainwright), and Delta Junction (Fort Greely).

The Air Force represented 38 percent of Alaska's military population. Alaska's Air Force bases are located in Anchorage (Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson), Fairbanks (Eielson Air Force Base), and Denali Borough (Clear Air Force Station).

The Coast Guard made up 10 percent of the military population in 2019. Alaska's Coast Guard locations include Anchorage, Cordova, Juneau, Kodiak, Sitka, Petersburg, and Valdez.

Boroughs and census areas with bases tend to have a high percentage of population in the military. For example, in 2019, active duty military and dependents were 19 percent of the Fairbanks North Star Borough's population, 18 percent of Kodiak Island Borough, and 14 percent of Denali Borough.

Legislative Districts


The Alaska Redistricting Board established the current House and Senate districts for the Alaska Legislature in 2013. The state has 40 House districts and 20 Senate districts. Table 3.2 provides district population data. In 2019, the average population of the House district areas was 18,275 and the average for the Senate areas was 36,550.

School Districts

Table 3.3 shows the population within Alaska school district boundaries in 2010 and 2019. Of the 53 school districts in 2019, the Anchorage School District had the largest population within its boundaries, with 291,845 people. The district

was home to 40 percent of the state's total population. At the other end of the spectrum, the Pelican School District had the fewest people within its boundaries. Only 69 people, or 0.01 percent of the state, lived there.

The six school districts with the fastest-growing populations in their boundaries from 2010 to 2019 were Matanuska-Susitna Borough (20 percent increase), Municipality of Skagway (13 percent), and Yupiit (12 percent). For comparison, Alaska's population grew by 3 percent over the same period.

Canadian Areas Adjacent to Alaska

Alaskans visiting Canada or conducting business there frequently use information on areas adjacent to Alaska. Table 3.4 includes population figures for selected areas and communities in Yukon Territory and along the border of British Columbia, taken from Statistics Canada's 2006, 2011, and 2016 censuses. The adjacent areas within British Columbia (56,240 people) and the Yukon (35,874) contained 92,114 people in 2016, compared to Southeast Alaska's 2016 population of 73,827.

Alaska Native Regional Corporations

The Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971 created 12 Alaska Native Regional Corporations that cover the entire state except for the Annette Island Reserve, which is Alaska's only American Indian reservation. Table 3.5 shows population estimates for each regional corporation. The estimates are for the Alaska Native and American Indian population living within these regions, not shareholders.

The Alaska Native Regional Corporation areas with the largest numbers who were Alaska Native alone or in combination in 2019 were: Cook Inlet (58,077), Calista (23,467), Doyon (16,679), and Sealaska (15,691). Four of the 12 corporations had populations that were at least three-quarters Alaska Native: Calista (89 percent), NANA (84 percent), Bering Straits (81 percent), and Bristol Bay (76 percent).

Alaska Native Village Statistical Areas

The Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971 also identified 209 Alaska Native villages. Populations for these villages were first reported in the 1980 Census. For the 1990 Census, the Census Bureau changed the name to Alaska Native Village Statistical Area and worked with local officials to delineate boundaries.

ANVSA designations and boundaries change with each decennial census and may have boundaries that are the same or different from those of cities or "census designated places," which are another type of statistical area delineated by the U.S. Census Bureau. In the 2000 Census, there were 208 ANVSAs and Tribal Designated Statistical Areas (a category that is no longer used), and as of the 2010 Census, there were 221. (See Table 3.6.)

Chapter 4

Alaska Places

Introduction

This chapter provides population estimates through 2019 for Alaska places, including cities and census designated places. Cities include all 149 of Alaska's incorporated places that existed as of January 1, 2019.

CDPs are statistical areas delineated by the U.S. Census Bureau. They have no legal status but are based on local areas with population. Except where noted otherwise, all numbers presented here, including those for 2000, are based on 2019 geography.

Further data, including annual census tract estimates and estimates by age and sex for places of 1,000 or more people, are available on the Research and Analysis Section's website (laborstats.alaska.gov).

Population by Size of Place

Figure 4.1 shows Alaska's population by size of place and delineates those greater than and less than 2,500 people. The places with 2,500 or more residents in 2019 are listed in order of population size in Table 4.1.

Table 4.2 provides population estimates by borough/census area and place for 2000, 2010, and 2019. Table 4.3 lists places alphabetically with their 2000, 2010, and 2019 total populations as well as their 2010 Census Federal Information Processing Standard codes.


Thirty-six places in Alaska had populations above 2,500 in 2019, and these were home to 80 percent of Alaska's population. The Municipality of Anchorage — the state's largest city — made up 40 percent of the overall population.

Alaska's population living in the 318 places with fewer than 2,500 people made up 18 percent of the total population, and 3 percent of Alaskans resided outside any city or CDP. Most people living outside of a place were within a borough and near a city or CDP, or along a road system.

Unorganized Territory

Slightly under three-fifths of Alaska's land area lies outside any incorporated city or borough. In this unorganized territory, the state performs all governmental functions.

An estimated 18,972 people, or 3 percent of the state's population, lived in this unorganized territory in 2019; in 2010, its population was 19,392.

In 2000, 19,621 people, or 3 percent, lived in unorganized territory (2010 geography). In 1990, it was 23,158, or 4 percent of the population. In 1980, it was 20,000, or 5 percent.

The majority of people living in unorganized territory reside in a CDP. The number who lived in unorganized territory outside of a CDP in 2019 was 2,179, or 0.3 percent of the state population. The 2010 Census counted 2,327 people in these areas.

All but a few hundred of them lived outside communities but along a road system that allowed access to a community. Only a very small number lived in isolation on islands or in remote Alaska with access to a community only by bush plane or small boat.

Alaska Boroughs and Census Areas, 2019



Aleutians East Borough



Aleutians West Census Area









Hoonah-Angoon Census Area






